ATTENDANCE MATTERS



On Tuesday 10 September, a group of lucky pupils were treated to a visit to Wembley to watch England play Finland. These pupils were randomly selected from a group of pupils with 100% attendance since the start of the academic year.

In a night they will never forget, this special event was a reward for beginning the year with excellent school attendance. This is just one of the many special events throughout the year to celebrate great attendance.





Being in school is important to your child's achievement, wellbeing, and wider development. Evidence shows that the students with the highest attendance throughout their time in school gain the best GCSE and A Level results. National research found that pupils who performed better both at the end of primary and secondary school missed fewer days than those who didn't perform as well.

Every moment in school counts, and days missed add up quickly. For example, a child in Year 10 who is absent for three days over a half term could miss 15 lessons in total. The higher a pupil's attendance, the more they are likely to learn, and the better they are likely to perform in exams and formal assessments.

95%		47 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 8 days in total or 1 week and 3 days
90%	-	95 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 16 days in total or 3 weeks and 1 day
85%	=	142 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 24 days in total or 4 weeks and 4 days
80%	=	190 LESSONS MISSED EACH YEAR 32 days in total or 6 weeks and 2 days
