

## **Rowing Success: Teams Qualify for United Learning National Finals**





## <u>WORKING ON WELLBEING</u>



Dear Parents and Carers,

Since starting as the Academy's Senior Mental Health Lead in September, I have been working hard on our Mental Health and Wellbeing support offer in school and wanted to fill you in on some updates.

In January, 16 members of staff successfully completed their Mental Health First Aider training and are now fully equipped to confidently support pupils who may be in crisis or struggling with their mental health. We have highlighted to pupils in school who these adults are if they need them and will be sharing this information with you on our website if you ever need to get in touch.

Since the opening of our Attendance and Safeguarding Hub (ASH) in November we have been able to support around 100 pupils a week, by having an adult on hand to support if they are struggling, and through offering Lego Therapy, Emotional Regulation, Anger Management and Drawing and Talking sessions. Alongside this, the Hub also acts as a safe space for pupils during social times and supports pupils who have not been able to attend school for some time with reintegrating back to lessons.

I will be sharing information about a local service in each newsletter - this month we have the Children's Autism Support Service (CASS). They are a brilliant service that offer support to both Parents/Carers and young people who have or are awaiting an autism diagnosis. On the next page is their newest offer of social groups for young people, along with their website information.

Lastly, we held a Wellbeing Parent Consultation morning, with school's Senior Education Mental Health Practitioner Fallon Holden, to allow parents to discuss any concerns they had around their child's wellbeing and offered advice on services that could support. We will be holding these consultation morning's each half term. Our next one will be with the School Nursing team, and will be ideal for discussing anything from sleep to fussy eating - keep a look out for further information on bookings after half term.
