
Elsewhere, one of our Year 11 pupils, Corey, was given the privilege to

#### Year 9 STEM Event


The Smallpeice Trust visited Hartshill Academy to treat 60 Year 9 pupils to a STEM event based on train travel. The pupils were asked to work as a team to design a sustainable train and train station. The day started with a tower challenge, where the pupils had a set amount of time to build the highest tower - the competition among the groups was fierce!

The pupils were then given the opportunity to build a fully working train chassis with a carriage that they designed and crafted out of foam. All teams were given a budget to work with and they had to present their work to each other, pitching their plans 'Apprentice' style!



During the half term, Year 11 were invited in for revision sessions, to help them to prepare for their mock exams. The uptake was great, with many pupils attending sessions on both days.

Biology, Chemistry and Physics topics were covered during this time, providing invaluable last-minute revision for all that attended. Dr Khan was so impressed with the enthusiasm and engagement shown by all the pupils.

## SPARK SOMETHING

At Hartshill Academy, we use Sparx Learning to support our young people to develop their independent learning skills. Every subject is different, so each Sparx system is carefully researched and designed to maximise impact in that discipline. We use Sparx Learning in our core subjects: English, Maths and Science.







#### SPARX Reader

Every week, pupils across year seven, eight and nine are completing Sparx Reader Homework. Reading has many benefits; it can improve academic performance and can contribute towards success at GCSE. Each week, every pupil is expected to complete thirty minutes of Sparx Reader homework.

All Sparx Reader homework will now be set on a Thursday and due on the following Thursday. This means that English teachers can track through the week and offer support to anyone who is struggling. If Sparx is completed at the weekend, pupils will have done their homework well in advance of the deadline, reflecting the HART value of ambition and tenacity. Through completing their homework, pupils have the opportunity to achieve Sparx Reader points and enter prize draws. If there are any issues with computer access, pupils are welcome to access laptops in 214 at lunch time. Any questions, please contact Miss Jones.

#### SPARX Science

This month, Sparx Science has been launched to all pupils! This is a great platform for science homework that supports learning and allows pupils to take part in independent learning in their own time. Each class has been set homework on a Thursday morning and is due the following Thursday. Dr Khan is keeping an eye on the deadline data and there will be a leaderboard (complete with rewards) coming soon!
